Flora Dungan Files For **Board Of Regents**



Flora Dungan, a former member of the State Assembly and the woman who filed the lawsuit that resulted in expansion of the University of Nevada Board of Regents, today filed for election as a member of the Board of Regents.

She said she will seek election in newly created District E, one of three non-partisan Regent's posts on the ballot this year.

Miss Dungan was considered one of the most outspoken and controversial members of the legislature during her two terms in the Assembly, beginning in 1963 and 1967.

It was in 1967 that she filed the lawsuit that resulted in enlargement of the Board of Regents, giving Clark County two additional seats on the

In 1964 Miss Dungan, a Las Vegas accountant, filed the suit that forced reapportionment of the Nevada legislature, giving Clark County seven additional seats in the Senate and four more in

She was one of five co-founders in 1963, along with Mike O'Callaghan, Justice David Zenoff, Art Olson and Audrey-deane Sullivan, of the Student Aid Foundation, which filled the gap for much needed scholarships at UNLV.

A lifetime member of the NAACP, she was honored in 1963 with the NAACP's Human Relations award for her civil rights fight in the

One of the key legislators who fought for a separate budget for UNLV, Miss Dungan was known as being "ahead of the times" in advocating progressive legislative ideas that have since come to pass. She was a leader in the fight for Nevada civil rights legislation and in the 1967 session supported abolition of capital punishment, a position just approved by the U.S. Supreme Court.

The first woman ever to serve on a legislative judiciary committee, Miss Dungan was a leader in the fight for prison and rehabilitation reforms in Nevada, as well as expanded juvenile assistance programs in the courts.

A graduate of the University of California with a graduate degree in social work, Miss Dungan was chairman of both the Social Welfare committee and the Elections committee in the Assembly.

A 24-year resident of Las Vegas, she has been a member of both the Clark County and the State Central Committees of the Demo-

She and her husband, Ray ben David, reside at 1705 Cochran. He is director of FOCUS, the local youth services organization which recently received a federal grant to expand its aid to young runaways.

Love And Kindness A **Much Needed Attribute**

In this way, even if, sometimes what you at first suspected should be true, still go out of your way to be kind to them- this kindness will help them to become better.

After all, why should any foreign people be treated as strangers? Let those who meet you know, without your proclaiming the fact, that you indeed are a Baha'i.

The wrong in the world continues to exist just because people talk only of their ideals, and do not strive to put them in practice. If actions took the place of words, the world's misery would very soon be changed into comfort. My hope for you is that you will ever avoid tyranny and oppression; that you will work without ceasing till justice reigns in every land, that you will keep your hearts pure and your hands free from unrightedusness.

This is what the near approach to God requires from you, and this is what I expect of you.

God is hope. God is now.
