Jack Petitti Files For Commission



Jack Petitti, a North Las Vegas business and civic leader, filed today for the newly formed county commission position in District B as a Democrat.

Petitti has a record of public service in North Las Vegas and in Clark County, serving on the city council for 12 years including several terms as mayor pro-tem, and representing the area on the Clark County school board. He has been a county resident for 38 years.

Discussing his campaign platform Petitti said, "I think it's important that the people in the North Las Vegas area have a county commissioner they can talk to regarding their problems and I will maintain an open-door policy throughout my term of office. Anyone wanting to contact me can reach me by telephone and I will see to it that their problems will get a fair hearing."

The former councilman also said he would support an updated master plan to insure an orderly growth pattern in Clark County.

"Our youngsters today need leadership and understanding to face the complex problems of our society," Petitti stated, "and I would hope to provide some of that leadership as an elected county official. My experience in this area would be of help to me when voting on issues and formulating new policies."

as a former member of the Spring Mountain
Youth Camp advisory board I came face to face
with the unhappy conditions that create problems
for our youngsters. As a commissioner I would
work to help youngsters in trouble."

Petitti has been particularly active in the local Boy Scouts movement and has been awarded

the highest honor of that organization, the Silver Beaver Award. His other civic activities include: being named Outstanding Young Man of the Year by the Jaycees, director many years and president of the Nevana Municipal Association, director of the National Recreation and Park Association, recipient of PTA life membership, first president of the Rancho High School Booster Club, five years as North Las Vegas chairman of the March of Dimes, and newly elected chairman of the 1973 Southern Nevada Youth Fair. As well as being president of the North Las Vegas Kiwanis Club, he is active in the VFW and American Legion.
