

# JAMES COUNCIL FILES FOR ASSEMBLY SEAT 7



James Council feels that little has been accomplished for the Black community in the quarter of a century he has witnessed here in Nevada.

James emphatically states that, "It is time for Blacks to recover." One of the many inequities cited is property tax. Specifically homeowners (Black) in the Regal Estates and Valley View areas, they live in the same model homes as in the (white owned) Charleston Heights area, not only do the Black property owners pay more taxes, but his investment which he was forced into by race prejudice is only attractive to less than 10% of the home buying market.

This young outspoken Black candidate for Assembly District #7 feels not only should an adjustment be made in the property tax, but a refund is owing to each and every property owner in the Ghetto community.

Legislation is needed to minimize, if not do away with, the utility deposits. None of us can do without lights, water, telephones, etc. The middle class society does not understand any of the problems of Black folks so they cannot understand what it means to a Black family making \$400.00 per month to spend almost one-third of that income on utility deposits.

Consumers Report states that Black people per capita spend more money on groceries and other essentials that require a sales tax. "The only logical and equitable tax is the State income tax and I will promote and fight for an equal taxation structure in Nevada," states James.

On Welfare - Aid to Dependent Children is not a Black problem, but, if the so-called middle-class conservative whites want to make it our problem, then we'll take it and make a better life for all of the less fortunate.

On Drugs - Many of my brothers and sisters who are narcotic addicts are pleading for help. Their only escape is a State financed methadone clinic.

Credit Bureaus - Consumer protection is needed for Black families who have been the victims of over-priced merchandise. The unnecessary harassment from the white credit bureaus has to come to an immediate halt!

I know the problems of the Black people and I intend with all sincerity to represent us if I am elected to the Assembly for District #7.

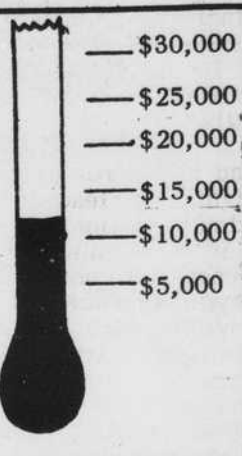

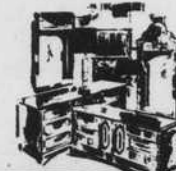
