program.
"There is a great awareness by shopping center developers of their role in broadening minority employment at the executive level. This, coupled with the growing demand within the industry for trained managers, promotion directors, and leasing agents, has opened up a new career field for minorities. We have on hand at ICSC specific job listings from members for all the graduated of this and future insti-tutes," said Leonard L. Farber, CMS, Chair-man, Urban Affairs Committee.

To be eligible for the Association's Executive Development Institute for Minorities all candidates must have education or experience in either business, management, real estate, accounting, law, advertising, or media. "This Institute represents a unique opportunity for blacks, Puerto Ricans, Mexican-Americans and other minorities who wish to change their present career fields and have the education, back-ground and aptitude to be trained for jobs within the shopping center industry," Mr. Farber said.

All candidates for the Institute must be able to undertake an intensive, eight-hour a day training cycle for the program's two-week duration. A minimum of two years college education is required. Applicants can come from any sector of the country, Detailed information will be required on business background, education and career goals.
