

"Sixty Years of Soul and Celluloid" is the theme of the upcoming San Francisco Bay area's Black Expo Film Festival. It's objective is to bring to the cinema going audience the lost obscured knowledge of Black cinematic participation. Part of the program will also deal with the contributions of Blacks in other countries to the wealth of the cinema. It will run from Sept. 7th through the 10th ... The N' York Chapter of the Drifters., Inc. are expecting the participation of some 200 members at its national convention Aug. 10-13 at the Waldorf Astoria. The theme of this, their 16th confab, will be "The Now Black Woman"...The annual convention of the 369th Veterans Association has been set for Granit II Resort Hotel in Kerhonkson, N. Y. Oct. 6-9. The vets are expecting a hige crowd and have taken over the entire hotel ... The Progressive B aptists will hold their eleventh annual session at the Sherman House in Chgo. Sept. 5-10. This time they will ad-dress themselves to the theme, "The Call of God and Our Response." This meeting is of historic significance to the Progressives as they will be returning to the city where tenure was voted by the National Baptist Convention, Inc. twenty years ago. Doctors Ralph Abernathy, B. L. Hooks, and Jesse Jackson are expected to attend. Dr. Benjamin E. Mays will be one of the featured speakers.

According to an announcement by Attorney General Richard G. Kleindienst, Blacks will no longer have to gamble for jobs in Las Vegas. based on an action started last year 17 major Las Vegas hotels and casinos signed a consent decree requiring them to hire and train Blacks as casino dealers and other higher paying jobs in the dice capitol. Circus Circus, Inc., which just opened a 500 room hotel in the gambling paradise, was required to hire one Black employee for every three other employees hired in 22 job classifications until 12-1/2% of the workers in each category were Black. Now that Blacks are working and gambling in the white hotels most of the gambling joints in the Black communities have closed. You win some, you lose some, and some are rained out...The Honorary Committee for the Dance Theatre of Harlem, Inc. reads like a who's who of the political whirl. LOS ANGELES, --Motown Records and its affiliate labels, Tamla, MoWest and Natural Resources, began shipment this week on their August releases that includes new album product by Jermaine Jackson, Valerie Simpson, Lesley Gore and Gotham.

Jermaine Jackson, member of the Jackson 5, debut album as a single artist on the Motown label, titled "Jermaine," follows the successful single debut of his brother Michael's "Got To Be There' album, and the J-5's "Looking Through The Windows" album which hit the top ten on the nation's music trade charts in less than six weeks after being released. The Jackson 5 are currently on their annual summer tour.

"Valerie Simpson" marks Valerie Simpson's second solo album on the Tamla label, since making the move from writer-producer to writer-producer-arranger-performer. Valerie Simpson and Nick Ashford, he co-produced her album, are currently preparing for an appear-ance July 29 on "Soul At The Center," cele-bration of Black Theatre, Dance, Poetry and Music, at the Lincoln Center for the Performing Arts in New York City. She has been scheduled to make her nightclub debut at the Troubador

in Los Angeles beginning August 1. Debuting on the MoWest label is Lesley Gore with "Someplace Else Now," a Joe Porter Production featuring a collection of 12 original songs written by Lesley in partnership with Ellen Weston.

The Motown August release scheduled will also introduce several new artists, prominent among them is Gotham with "Pass The Butter," for Natural Resources. Gotham is a soul-rock group comprised of Chris Qualles who played fender bass for Martha Reeves and the Vandellas; Alfred Ellis saxophone and flute formerly with James Brown Sam & Dave and others; John Gatchell trumpet and fluegel-horn formerly with Maynard Ferguson and Doc Severinson; James Strassburg drums formerly with The Hot Rock; Frank Vicari saxophones and flute formerly with Woody Herman's Herd; and Link Chamberlin formerly with the Young Rascals. Schuylar Ford does the vocals on the album produced by Tom Wilson.
