Clark County Community College will offer a new career program in data processing beginning with the fall semester, according to Donald I. Starr, associate dean of technical services and data processing instructor at the college.

The new two-year program will prepare students for entry-level employment in computer programming. As well, consideration will be given skills necessary for advancement into supervision, systems analysis, and management.

Students successfully completing the program will earn the college's associate of applied science degree in data processing.

To accord with student needs, classes will be offered during the day, evening, and Saturday mornings. The program is open to all students planning careers in data processing as well as those currently employed in the field.

Program admission will be based on interviews and aptitude testing conducted by the college.

Course work will cover classes in accounting, communication, psychology, mathematics, statistics, and programming in Assembler, COBOL, FORTRAN, and RPG, plus application development.

Class size is anticipated to be about 40 students this year and preliminary interest has been extensive. Interested students should contact Starr at 385-0195 and make an appointment for the interview and aptitude test.

Fall registration at the college is scheduled for August 23-24. Registration at the Boulevard Mall is set for August 25.

The community college maintains an open door policy admitting any high school graduate or adult who is capable of profiting from continuing education. Tuition is \$10 per credit hour and a variety of financial aid is available for qualified students.
