

Aaron Williams To Fight For Public Transportation

County Commission candidate Aaron Williams today said that, if elected in November, he would push for more complete public transportation from North and West Las Vegas.

Williams, the first black elected local official in Nevada's history, said there is no direct bus route to and from West and North Las Vegas residential areas to the North Las Vegas business district.

"As one who once walked ten miles to get to work each day, I know what it is to be without convenient and inexpensive public transportation," said Williams.

The 50-year-old Reynolds Electric executive said that the Clark County Commission has granted public monies to subsidize the operation of the local transit system.

"If the company can take our money to stay in business, it should be held responsible for providing adequate service to this community," he said.

"When I was elected to the North Las City Council," he continued, "I worked hard to get the first bus service to West Las Vegas. I learned how to put the pressure on the right people and in the right places. I want to use that experience as a County Commissioner to get even more cooperation," said Williams.

"There is no excuse for North Las Vegas West Las Vegas to be routed to downtown Las Vegas just to get to the North Las Vegas business district.

"It is not only inconvenient for the passengers, but deprives our local businesses of customers," he concluded.

Aaron has maintained an open door policy as an elected official and will continue to be available to those in his even larger Commission District "C."

ary degrees.

He was director of the Medical Division, British Plasma Project, 1938-40; and the first director of the American Red Cross Blood Bank. He was surgical consultant for the European Theatre of Operations during W.W. II; a member of the American - Soviet Science Committee (1944), and several other important assignments.

Dr. Drew was recognized internationally as a foremost authority on preservation of blood plasma for emergency transfusions and his work on the British blood bank project served as a guide for the United States and W.W. II allies.

While a student Charles Drew was listed among the top hurdlers in the country and rated as one of the football greats of his time. He captained varsity teams at both Amherst and McGill.

He was the author of many papers and treaties. His medical papers are still regarded as standard reading for research scholars.

He was an outstanding teacher and devoted the greater part of his professional career in training qualified Negro surgeons. He was a Spingarn Medalist of the NAACP and other tributes to his surgical and humanitarian skills.

Dr. Drew was also an authority in surgical shock and fluid balance in surgery.


Voter Information

Voters who have had a change of address since the November, 1970 election, and who did not record that change with the Election Department by August 5th, 1972 (the close of registration for the Primary election) will not receive a sample ballot at their new residence for the election of September 5th. This announcement was made by Stanton B. Colton, Registrar of Voters because of the numerous calls received by his office.

Colton said that the approximately 95,000 sample ballots that are being mailed this week went forward via bulk mail to the address of record at his office, and the Post Office does not forward bulk mail. The names of those voters who did not submit their new address before the deadline will appear only at their former polling places.

NRS 293.525 provides that any elector who has moved from one precinct to another within the county since the last preceding general election must submit a signed request to the Registrar of Voters before his Affidavit can be transferred to his new precinct.
