

## SCHOOL STARTING TIME ANNOUNCED

All elementary students with the exception of those in Virgin Valley will be in school from 8:45 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., according to John Paul, associate superintendent for administration for the Clark County School District.

Those in Virgin Valley will be on a varying schedule, depending on grade level, with kindergarten children attending from 8:45 a.m. to 11:00 a.m.; students in first through third grade attending from 8:45 a.m. to 2:30 p.m., and those in grades four through six from 8:45 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.

## LV SELF-HELP FACILITY FOR POOR OPENS

With an anticipated business opening Aug. 15, volunteer workers are busy refurbishing the old Cove hotel at "D" Street and Jackson Avenue to house Operation Life, a project to house community service and self-help organizations under one roof in West Las Vegas.

The old hotel kitchen and cafeteria facilities will be used not only for feeding programs for youth and the elderly but also to train people on welfare salable job skills, according to Operation Director, Art Grant.

The bar will be torn down and replaced by a child day care center, he said.

Hotel rooms will house an employment center consumer counseling, drug counseling and legal services offices while ground floor shops will be used to help poor people learn business skills, he added.

While the project will use some government grants, Grant said, it will operate mainly through volunteer contributions in aid and in kind.

The project, he said, is one of poor people helping themselves. Consultants from the business community will be brought in to help train people in business operations, he added.

One of the advantages of this policy, he said, is the program will not be restricted by government policies. "If we find we're doing something wrong, we'll change," he said. "Won't have to go to Washington to get an okay."

The first program to move into the building will be the Youth Development Program to aid school dropouts and other youths in setting up businesses, the Welfare Rights Organization, and the day care center, said Ruby Duncan, Operation Life, chairman.

Grant said the program will be unique in the United States. Its goal he said is that when a person walks into the building whatever his needs are, they can be taken care of.

Mrs. Duncan said the project is oriented towards all racial and ethnic groups and religions and will not discriminate.
