

CONGRESS OF AFRICAN PEOPLE 2ND BI-ANNUAL INTERNATIONAL ASSEMBLY

On August 31 through September 4, 1972, the Congress of African People will be holding its 2nd Bi-Annual International Assembly in San Diego, California. The Assembly will be hosted by the Western Regional Coordinator of the Congress of African People, Imamu Vernon Sukumu. The 1st Congress of African People International Assembly was in 1970 in Atlanta, Georgia, at which time the theme of "unity without uniformity" was first put into action with speakers from a diverse background of ideological influence, from the late Whitney Young, Jr., of the Urban League, to Minister Louis Farrakhan of the National Islam.

The 2nd International Assembly will focus more specifically on Nationalist and Pan-Afrikanist development not only in the U.S. but around the world. It will be using its theme "Kazi (Swahili for 'work') is the Blackest of all." Speakers for the 2nd Assembly will include Imamu Baraka, C.L.R. James, Owusu

Sadaukai, and representatives from Organization of African Unity, TANU (Tanganyikan African Nationalist Union), PDG (Democratic Party of Guinea), FROLIZI (Front for the Liberation University, of Zimbabwe), Roy Innis CORE, Nelson Johnson, of SOBU, Malcolm X Liberation University, Joe Waller of JOMO, Edward Vaughn of Pan African Congress.

C.L.R. James, the noted West Indian Pan-Afrikanist author, will deliver an address on "Black People in the Future of Human Civilization." Owusu Sadaukai, Mwalimu of Malcolm X Liberation University and organizer of the African Liberation Day march in Washington, D.C., will report on his travels on the continent in an attempt to distribute the film made of the recently overwhelmingly successful African Liberation Day. The various representatives of continental African political parties will relate the dynamic necessary for organizing national mass oriented political structures to the need

for such structures in the U.S. and West Indies. Spokesman for the OAU will address the Assembly introducing the programs of the new Secretary of OAU, Nzo Ekegaki.

Imamu Amiri Baraka, Program Chairman, Congress of African People, will report on the political movement in the U.S. and the processes necessary to put together a national Black political institution, that have developed since Atlanta, 1970 with specific analysis of the National Black Political Convention in Gary, Indiana. Black Leadership's input into the recent Democratic National Convention in Miami, and the on going function of the National Black Assembly which is scheduled to meet in Chicago October 21, 1972. This report will be hi-lighted by the release of Imamu Baraka's lengthy essay called "Gary - Miami: Pre and Post," which is scheduled also to be released in "Black World" in September 1972. It is a highly critical analysis of the current political leadership of Black America.
