She, along with Mrs. Mable Hoggard and school principal Helen Anderson won the plaudits of the Black community and the respect of the total community when they openly testified against the School District's Integration Plan.

Bernice Moten taught in the Clark County School District 10 years and is well acquainted with what happens in Clark County Schools, possessing invaluable information with which to work as a member of the Trustee Board. She is presently employed as a staff member of the State Board of Education where she continues to fight for fairness and minority involvement in every facet of the education process.
