Dove Season starts Friday

Take thaat scattergun from its off-season hideaway, oil it up, and get ready for the dove season opener that starts on September 1 throughout Nevada.

Hunters of this swift-flying migrant can expect birds to be scattered as a result of recent storms with prospects of hunting in the desert areas good this year. Nevada Fish and Game officials report that cooler weather in northern areas has triggered the yearly migration of doves to warmer climates in the south.

In Clark and Nye Counties, the bag limit of 10 daily and 20 in possession can include the white-winged species as well as the more common mourning dove. Hunting hours are from one-half hour before sunrise to sunset with the season scheduled to close October 20.

Only shotguns incapable of holding more than three shells, two in the magazine and one in the chamber, are legal for hunting doves as for all other migratory birds.

Sportsmen are advised to familiarize themselves with the recently passed county ordinances restricting discharge of firearms and to cooperate with farm and ranch owners before venturing onto private lands.
