RELIGIOUS SURVEY

A religious preference survey of Clark County School District employees may not be accurate, but at least it's over as far as personnel officials are concerned.

Nearly 1,500 of 5291 employees surveyed refused to return the form, circulated at the direction of the U.S. Equal Employment Opportunity Commission after one employee charged religious bias in promotion and seniority rights.

Returned forms broke down this way:

- 1954 employees say they belong to one of the Protestant denominations.

- 730 report a preference for the Catholic church.

- 673 say they are members of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saint (Mormon).

- 386 say they belong to some other church. and - 66 reported a preference for the Jewish faith.

Protestant denominations dominated all of 30 job classifications included on two survey forms, one for classified and one for certificated employees. Among school administrators, where charges of L.D.S. domination have pestered a predominantly protestant central office adminis-

tration for years, the breakdown showed:

- central office personnel: 39 Protestants, 14 Mormons, four Catholics, one "other" and 12 non-respondents.

- elementary principals - 29 Protestants, 20 Mormons, six Catholics, four "others," three non-respondents and one Jew.

- secondary principals - 28 Protestants, 19 Mormons, 12 Catholics, four "others," and one Jew.

Results of the survey were forwarded to Baltazar Yanez of the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission in Los Angeles yesterday by personnel director Charles Silvestri, who conducted the survey for the school district.
