COMMUNITY COLLEGE

Financial aid is available for qualified students enrolling in the spring alternate semester at Clark County Community College.

Thomas Brown, the college's financial aid officer, said both new and continuing students can take advantage of educational opportunity grants, . the college's work-study program, and a variety, of loans, including National Direct Student Loans.

More than 45 students currently are receiving financial assistance through the work-study program, which offers on-compus and offcampus employment.

On-campus jobs are available as desk clerks, human resource center assistants, library catalogers and classifiers, student activities assistants, duplicating machine operators, parking lot attendants, audio-visual operations, and stew-ards for the "Meals on Wheels" program. Off-campus employment currently is available

with the Nevada Mental Health Center, Economic Opportunity Board, and Operation Independence, a day care program. Additional off-campus opportunities are being developed.

Brown said his office attempts to place workstudy students in jobs related to their areas of study and personal interest.

To qualify, students must demonstrate financial need, enroll full-time for 12 or more credit hours, and maintain a "C" average. Each student is required to file a confidential statement with the American College Testing Program.

For qualifying students, Brown explained, the college attempts to work out a "package" of financial assistance, combining two or more of the programs available.


