## CLEAN HANDS MAY BE KEY TO FEWER COLDS

Simple, everyday handwashing may be more important in preventing the spread of the common cold than covering up coughs or sneezes, cold researchers at the University of Virginia report.

The cold culprits are rhinoviruses—a group of about 90 viruses that cause more than a third of all colds, the investigators point out. More rhinoviruses can be recovered from the hands of a person with a running nose than can be detected after a sneeze or a cough.

"Rhinoviruses can be transmitted by hand to almost anything--tables, clothing, other persons--and can survive as long as overnight," says Dr. Jack M. Gwaltney, Jr., head of the university's division of epidemiology and virology

Thus, Dr. Gwaltney observes, touching a table surface and then rubbing the nose may be enough to produce an upper respiratory infection.

Washing the hands regularly may help to
prevent a cold from spreading to other members
of the family, friends, and co-workers, Dr.
Gwaltney notes.

"If it is really true that rhinoviruses spread skin to skin," says the Virginia researcher, "then there may be some merit in looking for hand preparations, surface cleaners, and so forth, as control measures."

The need for frequent handwashing is well-known in hospitals where personnel often wash their hands as many as 30-40 times a day, to help prevent the spread of infection from patient to patient and to themselves.

Many hospitals use pHisoHex antibacterial skin cleanser, now on prescription. At the university, cold research which began a decade ago now involves more than 500 volunteers whose upper respiratory ills are carefully charted and studied.

Four new types of rhinoviruses are counted among the findings of the research team, Dr. Gwaltney says. Such discoveries are significant in any attempt to devise anti-viral drugs or multiple virus cold vaccines.
