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Powder Puff Mechanics

For many women, automobile engines are mysterious monsters which operate in strange incomprehensible ways.

However, women enrolling in a new class at Clark County Community College will have the opportunity to learn about automobile engines and

understand some of their mechanical mysteries. Beginning March 24, the college will offer a new community service class, powder puff mechanics for beginners, meeting each Saturday morning from nine until noon.

Bruce Bollman, course instructor, said the class will study the basic theory and technology of automotive engines, learning "what does what and why under the hood." "The course involves classroom training

only," Bollman said. "Practical, hands-on experience will be available for students progressing to advanced powder puff mehcanics.

Instruction will cover all mechanical parts of the automotive engine, including their operation and relationship to each other. In addition to textbooks, the class will utilize film-strips and demonstrations.

Registration for the class may be completed any weekday 9-4 p.m. at the college, 737 N. Main St. Class sessions will meet in the automotive lab at the Southern Nevada Manpower Training Center, 301 S. Highland.
