Marion Bennett Sites Need For Day Care Centers

Two weeks ago in a hearing before the Assembly's Ways and Means Committee on the welfare budget, Assemblymen Marion Bennett, Chairman of Assembly's Health and Welfare Committee, expressed a real concern for working mothers. He points out that this state takes great pride in the fact that many of the welfare mothers work, but the fact remains that there will be fewer mothers employed until there are more Day Care Centers, on a 24 hours basis, to take care of their children. He strongly emphasizes that the type of care that is needed is more than just a place where the children are placed in front of a television set eating cookies, but it must be a place for wholesome child growth and intellectual development.

Rev. Bennett has introduced legislation which addresses itself to the greatly needed child care facilities across the state. He stated that with the federal funds available through Title IV of the Social Security Act, the day care facilities can and must be provided. He further sees that these federal dollars will provide from 75% to 90% of the total operation cost of the program. He suggested also that the taxpayers of the state should not stand by and let other states use Nevadans dollars to support their programs when they are desperately needed in Nevada.

The child care legislation is one of a six-point program which are:

1. Raise the aid to Dependent Children (ADC) grant to \$67.00 per child per month.
2. Expand the ADC program to include families with unemployed fathers.
3. Include the medically needy in the state aid to Medically Indigent (SAMI) program.
4. Expand day care facilities so that the mother can go to work.
5. Include food stamps in the state budget for all of Nevada.
6. Enact an emergency assistance program for people of urgent need.

Assemblymen Bennett envisions possible passage of this legislation if the people of this state and the voters of Clark County will make their local representatives express a voting commitment for the bill.

Mr. Parks and Mr. Reedom are in the Information Systems Department. Each man has to devise procedures and programs for the solution of business and technical problems through the use of electronic data processing systems.

Mr. Parks received a B.S. in Agronomy at Arkansas A.M. & N. College and is currently a candidate for a Master of Business Administration at the University of Nevada. Mr. Reedom is a graduate of California State University where he earned a B.S. in Business Administration and is working towards an M.B.A. at the University of Nevada.

Mr. Parks' professional affiliations include the Association of Systems Management and the Association of Computer Programmers & Analysts. He is also a member of the Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity and the NAACP.

A native of New Edinburg, Arkansas, Mr. Parks lives in Las Vegas with his wife, the former Ruby McRae.

Mr. Reedom's professional memberships include the Association for Computer Program-

mers and Analysts and Omega Psi Phi Fraternity.

"The Federal Civil Rights Enforcement Effort -- A Reassessment," makes it abundantly clear that despite some improvement, the federal enforcement effort remains inadequate. Strong leadership and direction are absolutely essential.

Moreover, people are expressing concern throughout the country, evident in the recent organization of a broad-based civil rights coalition, that current policies of your Administration demonstrate a retreat from federal leadership for equal opportunity.

The fears cited include your reduction in Administration policies also include cutbacks in funding and freezes or terminations of programs that seriously will hurt minority groups in desperate need of decent housing, adequate health care, job opportunities, help to end the nightmare of poverty, and social services that help transform public dependency into self-sufficiency.

I respectfully urge you to re-evaluate such policies and to carry through the full responsibility for progress in civil rights that rests upon your office. You may be assured of my total support of efforts by your Administration to establish hope and opportunity for all Americans. Sincerely,
