

## Labor Union President Seek Increased Pensions

George Osley, Jr., President of the Laborer's Local 872 and Trustee of the Trust Fund's Health, Welfare, Pension and Vacation Fund, recently attended a meeting of the National Foundation of Health, Welfare and Pension Plans held in Palm Springs, California.

The meeting convened at the Spa Hotel, where more than 700 delegates were in attendance. Osley would like to point out that the Laborer's Union here has never had a pension fund until

1969. This fund started with ten cent an hour contributions and it is now paying pensioners \$305 dollars per month. He has a present goal set at \$1000 dollars per month, hopefully it can be reached in about six years. The plans on Health and Welfare are the best that can be obtained for members of the local and their entire family.

The vacation fund is among the highest in the nation, with one dollar per hour going into a saving for each hour that a member works.

Along with the executive board and members of the local union, the president hopes to have a (Fun For All) to be held Labor Day (Sept. 3, 1973) with the location to be announced later. The president would like to see more members attend the union meetings, held on the second Monday night each month at 3:30 P.M., so that they can be more aware of their union's activities. There is much to be done and much to be learned, but we must all work together.

MSU President Clifton R. Wharton, Jr., described Dr. King as a man of "transcendent stature." He said, "If we are to build a world resembling the dream of Dr. King, education must be a cornerstone.

"Martin Luther King showed that one man, living one beautiful life can make a difference in this world through God's gift of an inward and spiritual grace," Dr. Wharton said.

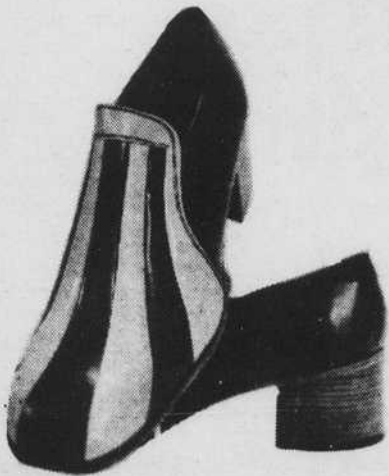
