Summer School **Begins June 18**

School ends June 8 for most of the nearly 76,000 students enrolled in the Clark County School District, but it doesn't have to end there.

Why not a course in auto mechanics or advanced work in music or drama for secondary students, or enrichment work in math, science or art for students of all ages this summer?

Summer school begins June 18, and all students interested are eligible. The big "why not?" is the price. Each course costs \$30.00 per student, because the summer school pro-gram must be totally self-supporting.

Elementary youngster, both those who need remedial work in reading and math and those who want to explore new fields through enrichment programs, are urged to pre-register by contacting their school. There they will receive pre-paid mailers with all the necessary enrollment information. Once that information is in and the enrollment fee has been paid, students simply need to show up for their first class on June 18.

Secondary students can pick up enrollment information from their counselor, then show up at either Rancho or Valley High on Thursday, June 14, to pay their fees.
