increase were increases in wages, increases in fuel costs, major expenditures for air pollution control and the substitution of high operating cost gas turbines for low cost hydro power which is being recalled by the Upper Colorado Region. The Company also stated that the nationwide shortage of natural gas is making it necessary to purchase high-cost, low-sulfur fuel oil and to provide storage, piping and pumping facilities to use this oil.

The application shows Nevada Power to be supplying 105,426 customers in the Las Vegas area and that the Company's investment per customer has risen from \$1,594 to 2,219 in the last five years.

In its application the Company stressed its need for a sound financial position in order to permit it to obtain funds for necessary facilities to meet the growing energy requirements of the people and businesses in the area.

The Company also pointed out that at the present time the average electric rate for the typical residential customer in Las Vegas was only about one-half of the national average.

Harry Allen, president of Nevada Power, said he did not know when the hearings on the rate increase would take place since that was a matter for the Public Service Commission to decide.
