## Archie Law Enforcement Academy Speaker

CARSON CITY--"Ethnic Problems Peculiar to the Black Race" was the topic of an address to the Clark County Police and Sheriff's Academy by Nevada's highest black in an appointive office.

Robert Archie, director of the Nevada Employment Security Department, spoke to the southern Nevada law enforcement group on June 7. He participated in a 12:30-4:30 p.m. session in ethnic studies for the academy.

Before his appointment as Nevada's employment chief, Archie frequently spoke to academy members in his former capacity as Assistant Public Defender for Clark County.

## Bible Joins Dem Caucus Resolution-90 Day Freeze

WASHINGTON--Senator Alan Bible, D-Nev., said today the unanimous adoption by the Senate Democratic Caucus of a resolution calling for an immediate 90-day freeze on prices, rents, consumer interest rates, wages, salaries and profits "is a clear sign that Congress will act forcefully to control inflation, even if the Administration will not."

The resolution adopted by the Senate Democrats pointed out prices are rising at the fastest rate in 22 years and declared that President Nixon's Phase III program is "an unmitigated failure."

Bible, who has repeatedly urged the President to use the authority given him by Congress to invoke new price controls, said "inflation is destroying the budgets of millions of American families."

"During the first quarter of the year, corporate profits soared up by more than 25 percent, he said. "At the same time, workers' real wages, after inflation and taxes, are now lower than they were six months ago."

Bible said the resolution directs the President to use the 90 days to establish--inconsultation with Congress, labor, farmers, business and consumers--a long-range program to control inflation that is firm, fair and equitable, taking into account the fact that wages have fallen behind in the inflationary cycle.

"With this endorsement by the Caucus," Bible said, "the Senate can move quickly to attach a freeze amendment to the first appropriate bill coming to the floor. There is already a Banking
