LAS VEGAS--A youth-only, youth-operated employment office for all Clark County high. school and college students looking for summer jobs, will open for business June 11, but employers with jobs for youths can place telephone orders now for full or part-time employees.

Job openings can be listed by calling either the Las Vegas Office of the Nevada Employment Security Department, at 385-3211, or the Clark County School District's Neighborhood Youth Corps (NYC) headquarters at 642-7272.

The two agencies will co-sponsor the summer employment office for youth in the latter's North Las Vegas offices at 1941 Jefferson St., near the intersection of Lake Mead Boulevard and Las Vegas Boulevard North.

Youth will serve youth in the summer jobs program with an assist from adult professionals, said Charles Smith, operations manager for the Las Vegas Employment Office. He has named Louise Clark, manpower specialist II at the employment office and a veteran of past summer youth program supervision, to oversee the operation.

Letting young people find jobs for young people has been successful in the past, both here and in Northern Nevada, Smith noted.

The manager also said the special employment office will serve all youths, regardless of family income.

"With employer cooperation we hope to have a healthy number of job openings in addition to those work opportunities provided by the NYC program for youths from low income families," Smith declared.

Smith and Chuck Musser, who heads the Clark County School District's NYC, agree a combined effort by their agencies and Clark County's private employer--both large and small --can make this summer's jobs for youth program succeed, despite wideswept federal cutbacks.

Smith referred to the federal government's junking of NYC funding, which severely reduced the number of jobs in government agencies available for disadvantaged youths this summer. (see JOBS, page 10)
