### SOCIAL SECURITY **BOOSTED 5.6%**

WASHINGTON--Senator Alan Bible said today the Senate's approval of a 5.6 percent cost of living increase for those on Social Security "is designed to keep the old, the sick and the disabled from being destroyed by runaway inflation."

The measure, approved by the Senate yesterday on a vote of 86 to 7, would the raise the average

monthly benefits for a retired couple from \$277 to \$293. Both Bible and Nevada's other Senator,

Howard Cannon, supported the increase.

Bible said the Social Security boost would not increase payroll taxes—only monthly benefits.

"In the past several months prices have skyrocketed," he said. "This increase is abso-lutely essential if those on Social Security are to have any chance of keeping pace with the cost

The Nevada Democrat said under the increase rovision, which was attached to the debt certify limit bill, minimum benefits go up for an individual from \$84.50 to \$89.30 and the average benefit for a retired worker without dependents from \$161 to \$170.

If approved by the House and signed by the President, the increases would go into effect next January.

Another provision of the bill would boost the guaranteed monthly minimum income for aged, blind, and disabled under the new National Federal Welfare System from \$130 to \$140 for an individual and to \$210 for a couple.

# Tom Bradley Sworn In As Mayor Of Los Angeles

One of the most significant days in the history of the west was recorded Sunday afternoon when Thomas Bradley was sworn in as the New Mayor of Los Angeles, California.

Being elected Mayor of the 3rd largest city in the USA is by no means an ordinary thing but for a Black to have achieved this position makes it more significant, especially when Blacks are

Leon Washington, Editor Publisher of the Los Angeles Sentinel appraised Bradley's election

by saying:
"Tom Bradley is the New Mayor of Los Angeles and there are some significant aspects to that simple fact."

"First, never before has a Black been elected Mayor of one of American's five largest cities. Second, the returns make it clear that for every Black vote Bradley got, he also got three white votes."

Some might say that these two facts mean that Blacks have come a long way in this country. We believe that these two facts mean that whites have come a long way in this country. To which we add the word also.

Altho the Former Mayor Yorty and California Governor Reagan were absent, those persons in attendance would read like Who is Who in America.

Locally we have seen Blacks elected to offices - getting more white votes than Black votes - which points up, that all of us have come a long way both Black & White alike. The message to the youth is very clear - you

can make it if you try.
