

PUBLISHERS SHARPEN THEIR AX.

HOUSTON, TEX .--- This oil rich, space program endowed city is saying something, beginning with newness and ending with progress. The pride in its promise as the 6th. largest in the U.S. has both its White and Black citizens riding tall in the saddle. As befits the time, there are no visible signs of racial barriers to befog the mirror of human dignity. Therefore Blacks can feel as spiritually and emotionally free here as they can in any "White owned city." like all things in Texas, the annual NNPA's convention was the organization's biggest in its 30-odd yr. history. The Lovely Lenora "Doll" Carter, publisher of the Houston Forward Times, was hostess, and she pulled out all the stops so that org. could express its way thru its 33rd gathering. Each program, unfolded in the posh Houston Oaks, a hotel second to none in appointments and hospitality, was meaningful and on the case of the Black thrust for a bigger mouthful of the fruits of democracy. Though parties and poker games were interspersed with the business at hand, there were no perversed incidents to incite offical antaganism.

As if affirming a Note Book predication, Dr. Carlton Goodlett, pub. of Frisco's Sun-Reporter, was elected NNPA's prexy. In the ensuing months you will hear much about this world traveling medic when he takes on the giants of industry and sports, which have ignored the Black Press, and the Blacks who hold "policy making" positions with them, but do nothing to aid the brothers. Among his plans is one to "press-lite" what he terms "the wrong men in the right jobs." It all could be very interesting. Al Lockhart used all of his TRW corp. connnections to secure a country club where Lieut. Gen. "Chappie" James could play a round of golf. Leroy Jeffries, the west coast PR-Guy, fashioned a jam-up bash to intro some of his high-powered 'chalk' clients to the pubs. His, and the ones Garth Reeves hosted, to say thanks to those who had made his 2-yrs as prexy of the NNPA successful, and MGM's, to set the proper tempo for an eye-view of "Shaft in Africa." were the most. Sherman Briscoe, exec-dir. NNPA, did a tremendous job of pulling the convention together. Near the end his long time friend, and former boss, John Sengstacke, made him hoppin mad and he quit. John, publisher of many newspapers, and the board refused to accept his resignation, but are not sure that Sherm will reconsider, even

in the face of a fat pay hike. Deadline for receipt of transcripts is July
16, according to UNLV Director of Admissions
Dallas Norton. However, extensions may be
requested by persons unable to meet the cutoff date, especially those who have just moved

Formal admission is required only for students wishing to take nine credit hours or more at the university. Community residents may still take classes part-time next fall without going through the admission procedure.
