

LAS VEGAS -- The Rev. Bob Harrington, internationally known as "The Chaplain of Bourbon Street," today announced that he will be conducting an 8-Day Crusade at the Convention Center beginning Sunday, July 22 and going through Sunday, July 29. Services will be held nightly at 8:00 p.m.

Mr. Harrington, called by many as "the most colorful and unusual Evangelist of the 20th Century'' said he was delighted at the chance to conduct the Crusade.
