Nixon Administration "Dragging Its Feet"—Bible

WASHINGTON-- Senator Alan Bible today charged the Nixon Administration with "dragging its feet" on the fuel shortage and warned further delay may "permanently cripple the independent sector of the gasoline industry."

Bible, Chairman of the Senate Small Business Committee, was particularly critical of the Administration's refusal to take action to require the major oil companies to comply with the fuel allocation guidelines announced in May.

"While many of the major firms are cooperating during the shortage," he said, "others have cut off independent customers completely and have refused to follow the guidelines."

The guidelines require oil and gas producers to allocate fuel to their customers on the basis of sales during 1972.

Citing a study released today by the Congressional Research Service, the Nevada Democrat said by the beginning of last month more than 1,020 retail gasoline dealers had been forced to close and that 1,914 were on the verge of doing so.

"I am still receiving complaints from Nevada reporting that some major oil companies have stopped selling fuel destined for independent stations in Nevada," he said. "Additionally, many customers of major companies maintain they are not receiving adequate supplies."

Bible also noted that Sun Oil Company has announced it will no longer follow the Administration's guidelines because it feels the program is not working.

"The Administration has the authority to ensure a fair and equitable distribution of fuel during shortages," he said, "but it continues to drag its feet. Apparently they hope if they ignore the problem it will go away."

Bible said the Research Service's report indicates the "very real possibility" of more severe shortages during the next three years if firm action is not taken.

"Congress has repeatedly urged the President to act," he said, noting that all three members of the Nevada Congressional delegation have called for a mandatory allocation program.

Several months ago Congress gave the Administration authority to set up a mandatory allocation program should the situation warrant, but thus far the President has stayed with his voluntary guidelines.

Last month the Senate passed the Emergency Fuel Allocation Act designed to establish its mandatory allocation program, and the bill is currently before the House.
