Hunting And Fishing
A "No Hunting" policy in National Parks will
protect the breeding herd after release and provide a reservoir for production and subsequent migration to surrounding areas of public land. FEE CHANGES FOR DUPLICATION LICENSE

Replacement of a lost fishing or hunting license will cost slightly more this year as a result of regulations passed by the last session of Nevada legislature.

Any license which originally cost more than four dollars will cost four dollars to replace. A duplicate for any license which cost less than four dollars can be obtained at a cost equal to

the original fee.

Department of Fish and Game officials provide the following examples: A resident fishing li-cense costs \$7.50 and a duplicate for that license, if lost or destroyed, will cost \$4.00. A junior fishing license has an original price tag of \$1.00, and if lost, replacement will require payment of the original fee of \$1.00.

Persons who wish to obtain a duplicate for a lost or destroyed license can go to any hunting and fishing license agent and secure the duplicate after paying the appropriate fee and signing

an affidavit.

All tags, permits and stamps that accompany hunting and fishing licenses for special purposes are replaceable as duplicates only at the original

Employment Security Department

CARSON CITY--The Nevada Employment Security Department found jobs for 2,534 Nevada veterans in the first six months of this year, a jump of 330 more veterans given free job help than in the same period last year.

Department Director Lawrence McCracken said the six-month total passed the 2,500-mark with June's 444 former Nevada servicemen and women helped into civilian occupations by the

department.


Veterans job placements in June included 209 Vietnam veterans. In the past six months through June, the department found jobs for 1,266 Vietnam vets, 80 more than in the corresponding period last year.

The federal government requires employment security departments in all state give top priority to finding jobs for veterans. The Nevada department has been the leader in its region this year for job help to vets, outranking California, Arizona, Hawaii and Guam.
