SPECIAL NOTICE TO NORTH VEGANS

For the convenience of our nearly 13,000 utility customers, the City of North Las Vegas is now sending out a new type of utility bill which not only includes the bill itself, but also encloses a pre-addressed return envelope. According to City Ordinance, if the initial billing is not paid within ten (10) days of receipt of same, a nominal late charge may be added to that bill.

If the initial bill is still not paid when the next monthly billing goes out, the second bill will contain a statement of arrears, late penalty, plus the second month's billing. When a billing picks up the prior month's arrears, the billing will contain a statement that unless paid within ten (10) days from date, utility service will be discontinued. As a further convenience to the utility customers of North Las Vegas a final notice will be sent out to those people who have not yet paid this dual billing and states that unless paid within five (5) days from date, utility service will be discontinued.

MOTORCYCLE LAW CHANGES

CARSON CITY---Two major driver licensing provisions were amended in Nevada's motor-cycle law during the 1973 Legislature reports the Department of Motor Vehicles.

William Fitzpatrick, Chief of the Department's Driver License Division, states that Class 4 motorcycle licenses issued after July 1, 1973 are now valid for four years rather than two years. "Further, a motorcycle endorsement now expires simultaneously with the expiration of the basic license to which it is endorsed. This also applies to all motorcycle endorsements issued prior to July 1, 1973 regardless of the fact that an earlier expiration date for the Class 4 endorsement appears on the license." Fitzpatrick emphasized that Class Four two-year driver licenses, as opposed to a motorcycle endorsement, issued prior to July 1, 1973 still are only valid until the expiration date reflected on the license.

The former operator-chauffeur type drivers license issued prior to January 1, 1971 still allow the holder to operate a motorcyle until the license expires. "However, when applying for a renewal license the individual must pass the motorcycle written and driving examinations if he wishes to continue operating a motorcycle" Fitzpatrick states.

The successful completion of a motorcycle training course is no longer required as a prerequisite to applying for a Class 4 motorcycle license or endorsement from the Department. The former law regarding the motorcycle training applied to those individuals who had never been licensed prior to January 1, 1972.

The new law further requires that the driver of a motorcycle shall drive with one hand on each handlebar at all times except when it is necessary to use or remove one hand for the safe operation of the motorcycle.

Another legislative bill enacted by the 1973 legislature applying to motorcycles provides that every motorcycle manufactured after January 1, 1973, which is sold or offered for sale and which is intended to be operated upon the highways of this state, shall be equipped with electric turn signal lamps.

Abandonment Of Vechicles Prohibited Under New Law

CARSON CITY---A bill passed by the 1973 Nevada Legislature prohibits the abandonment of vehicles and encourages the removal of abandoned vehicles from public and private premises, according to the Department of Motor Vehicles.

Everett Silva, Supervisor of the Registration Division's Vehicle Compliance and Enforcement Section, states that the new law encourages the development of procedures and techniques in cooperation with the local governments and the private sector, to facilitate the removal of abandoned vehicles.

A vehicle is presumed abandoned if it is left on a public highway or road for more than three days or on public or private property for more than 10 days without the property owner's consent.

Silva emphasized that the new law also serves to reduce auto theft. Nests of abandoned vehicles have been known to hide a stolen vehicle which is either in the process of, or has already been dismantled.

The new law indicates that every person who abandons a vehicle is responsible for the cost of removal and disposition of such vehicle.

Law enforcement personnel who have reason to believe that a vehicle has been abandoned in their jurisdiction may have the vehicle removed at the request of the person in control of the property, to a place designated by the proper authorities for storage.
