School Dist. Switchboard Operates 24 Hours

Anyone can reach the school district any hour by dialing 736-5011, and persons who see suspicious activity around a school are urged to do just that, according to security chief Bill Scherkenbach.

736-5011 is the general switchboard number for the school district. At night and on weekends, the number rings directly into the school district's security office.

Scherkenbach said he was "especially anxious" that the public understand that they can reach the district over the holidays. "Anytime we shut down schools for two weeks, the danger of malicious vandalism and burglary increases. Citizens can help us by reporting any and all suspicious activity," he said.

The school district operates several roving patrol cars evenings and on weekends, all of which are radio equipped. When a call comes in regarding suspicious activity around a school, one car is dispatched to the scene while others continue their routine patrols.

vices, as the 'majority' Americans will insist upon these for himself.'

The new census mapping system will allow HUD to determine the density of minority population, the location of HUD-subsidized projects, neighborhood transition and/or stability, minority migration or immigration, and the location of families below the government poverty level.

Noting the difficulties HUD had encountered in implementing its three-part program as outlined by president Nixon --- (a) correcting effects of past discrimination; (b) safeguarding against future discrimination, and (c) evaluating progress - Dr. Toote expressed the belief that the new census mapping system, "will prove invaluable to my office, and of vital importance to the total HUD responsibility ..."
