

WRITE SERIOUSLY - Hi'blood pressure is a killer - one which has wasted five times more humans than have been washed away by automobile accidents. Also called hypertension it can damage the heart, the brain, and the kidneys. It is the leading cause of strokes, congestive heart failure, kidney failure, a major risk factor in heart attacks, and is the major cause of death among Blacks. By the end of '73 this silent disease will be the major cause of mortality in America. It will account for one out of eight who die from anything. According to doctors like Aaron Wells and Carlton Goodlett, about 23 million folks are stuck with it. That's like one out of every ten adults, and of course youngsters kick the bucket because of it too. If you're over 50, or Black, look out the odds are even greater you've got it. Since it strikes with no symptoms, you can be Black and beautiful, feel healthy, look white and terrific, and still have it. You don't even have to be uptight to get it, as it hits those who stay loose as well.

Hyptertension is the greatest cause of death among urban Blacks. Those who haven't yet checked out their blood pressure are flirting with an early grave. Approximately 3,500,000 brothers and sisters are affected behind the frightening statistics that neigh-on to 3,000,000 of them are either aware, or are not receiving the proper treatment. In fact, half of the folks who have hi'blood pressure, some 11 million, don't know they have it. Out of the 23 million Americans with this problem, only 3 million are getting adequate treatment. That leaves some 20 million with a shortened lease on life. This is an American tragedy that must be faced up to, and thank heavens is, by a new drive set in motion by a far reaching National High Blood Pressure Education Program. Even if you're not in doubt see your doctor because only he can tell and only he can help you control it. Treatment is relatively simple and can, in most cases, effectively control the disease. Check out your blood pressure before your number is up.
