It is the purpose of the Library's film series to select representative feature films from the last sixty years to trace and illustrate the changing role of blacks in American films and therefore in American society. 1974 Emergency **Action Guide Sent To** Clark County Schools

Principals in the Clark County School District recently received copies of the 1974 Emergency Action Guide on how to handle disasters that could possibly occur in the District.

School Superintendent Dr. Kenny Guinn directed school administrators to incorporate the guide into the school curriculum.

Recognizing that local conditions must dictate how a school handles a disaster, the principals are authorized to modify procedures where local facilities and equipment warrant such modifica-

Guidelines are given for reacting to such disasters as fire, windstorm, fallen aircraft, civil disturbance, chemical accidents, explosions, and nuclear attacks.

The Guide stresses the paramount importance to the teacher will be the safety of his students and the removal of his rollbook in order that he may account for all children.

Physical plant and equipment obviously are secondary to the safety and lives of the students.

While no one likes to think of the tragedies that accompany disasters, whether caused by natural or human forces, the School District believes it is better to be prepared for an emergency so that these tragedies can be minimized or avoided should such a disaster strike in the County.
