Black Methodist For Church Renewal will convene in Los Angeles, the second week of March 1974. This national body of Black Methodist Clergy and Lay Members meet to form strategy for the role of the Black People in the white church. In route to this convention will be Methodist from all over America. One of those ministers will be Rev. Cornelius Henderson, Director of Urban Evangelism Ministries in the Section on Local Church of the Division of Evangelism, Stewardship and Worship of the general Board of Discipleship of the United Methodist Church. He has a special responsibility for churches in transitional neighborhoods and for interpreting the Black Church to white congregations.

Rev. Henderson will spend several days in Las Vegas prior to the Los Angeles Meeting as guest preacher at Zion Methodist Church. He will conduct a three-day revival at the church March 3 through 5, at 7:30 p.m. each night. Many of you may remember him as one of the speakers for the Martin Luther King, Jr. Memorial held here at the Convention Center several years ago.

A Georgia native, Re. Henderson is a graduate of Gammon Theological Seminary and holds the Master of Sacred Theology Degree from the Interdenominational Theological Center in Atlanta, Georgia. He pastored numerous churches in Georgia and worked as Director of Youth Work of the Georgia Conference. He served as Ad Interim President of Gammon Theological Seminary, Director of Recruitment for the Seminary, Trustee for Clark College and Board of Directors, Black Methodist for Church Renewal.

He leads an active community involvement with YMCA, Operation Breadbasket, Alpha Kappa Delta Honorary Sociological Society, Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc. Y's Men International, Greater Atlanta Summit Leadership Congress and the Georgia Voters and Educational Association. He is also a member of the NAACP. Rev. M. D. Bennett is inviting the public to attend these services and hear "one of God's best preachers."
