Prominent attorney Ralph Denton today became the first official candidate in the race for the Democratic nomination for Governor when he flew to Carson City and filed for the office this morning.

Although several other potential candidates have voiced an interest in the post, Denton, a 48-year-old resident of Boulder City, was the

first to appear before Secretary of State Will-iam Swackhanner and pay the filing fee.

A native of Caliente, Nev., Denton has held several public posts, including stints as a Clark County Commissioner, Deputy District Attorney for Boulder City.

In his announcement statement Denton pled-ged to "take the people of Nevada into partner-ship with their government," and stressed the need for men and women of integrity and honesty "to continue to seek public office" despite the troubled times brought on by Watergate.

Denton and his wife, Sara, are the parents of three children, Mark, 22, a law student in Washington, D.C.; Sally,, 20, a senior at the University of Colorado; and Scott, 18, a freshman pre-med student at the University of Nevada Reno.

Denton said he will take a state-wide tour "visiting every community in the state and meeting as many votoers as possible" in the next few weeks.

No stranger to the political wars, Denton twice ran for the Democratic nomination for U.S. House of Representatives (1964 and 1966), narrowly losing to then Rep. Walter Baring.
