SUN CAMPERSHIP PROGRAM

The Las Vegas Sun, in cooperation with the Economic Opportunity Board, of Clark County, is announcing the kickoff of its 1974 Sun Campership Program, which will provide youngsters of low-income, urban background the chance to go to camp this summer. The program functions primarily as a re-

cruitment and referral process whereby children who for financial and family reasons may not who for financial and family reasons may not be able to have camping experience. These youngsters are identified and recruited through the EOB, Clark County School District, Nevada State Welfare, Clark County Social Services, Juvenile Court Services, Easter Seals, Nevada State Children's Home, St. Jude's Ranch for Children, the Franciscan Center, and all youth agencies, Financing, fund-raising, and adminagencies. Financing, fund-raising, and administering of the program will be assisted by the EOB.

Camping experiences are learning experiences, according to Gary Kidwell, EOB Vista worker assigned to the project. "In addition to providing natural contacts with fresh air, sunshine. and wildlife, camping also offers social instruction in getting along with others and giving and following directions," he said. Charlotte Hill, Economic Opportunity Board member, and chairman of the Summer Camp

Fund, stated that recruitment would be done through various agencies and will also respond to direct inquiries from the public.

Both boys and girls from low-income families between the ages of 7 and 17 are eligible for the program," explained Mrs. Hill. "Par-ental permission is, of course required, as well as a physical examination which will be provided at no expense to the family of the eligible youngster," she continued.
