HARRIS NAMED TO HALL OF FAME BOARD



Las Vegas--Mr. Otis Harris, Tourism and Marketing Manager of the Las Vegas Convention and Visitors Authority, has been appointed to the Board of Directors of the Black Athletes Hall of Fame. Mr. Harris recently attended the Black Athletes Hall of Fame Banquet in New York City.

The Black Athletes Hall of Fame is a national organization recognizing outstanding accomplishments of individuals and teams in amateur and professional sports who have brought distinction to their country and communities. Candidates to the Hall of Fame are not required to be black as long as they achieve, accomplish or contribute to the advancement of blacks in sports. Outstanding athletes of the past are also eligible.

Future goals include preparing youths from the ghettos and major cities for entrance into the finest universities by giving them prep courses during the summer. Mr. Harris is actively involved in the Westside Athletic Association and serves on the Board of Advisors of the Clark County Community College.

Other well-known board members of the Black Athletes Hall of Fame include Charlie Mays (executive Director), Jesse Owens, Wilma Randolph, Bill Cosby and Howard Cosell.

Bervin Fisher, 33, was arrested by law enforcement officers of Metro Police and the F.B.I. The First National Bank of Nevada at 3rd and Carson was robbed of an undisclosed sum of cash (reported to be close to \$700,000) at noon, Monday.

IF YOU NEED MONEY FOR SCHOOL? APPLY FOR THE BEOG

On Saturday, May 11, 1974, 10:00 a.m., EOB Auditorium, Counselors from local high schools and UNLV will be available to aid high school seniors, college Freshmen and ex-students in filling out applications for the Basic Educational Opportunity Grant (BEOG).

The Basic Educational Opportunity Grant Program is a Federal aid program designed to provide assistance to those who need it to attend post-high school educational institutions. Basic Grants are intended to be the "floor" of a financial aid package and may be combined with other forms of aid in order to meet the full costs of education. The amount of your Basic Grant is determined on the basis of your own and your family's financial resources.

You will be eligible for a grant if you meet several important criteria:

1. You have established your financial need by means of the BEOG application.
2. You began or will begin your post-high school education AFTER APRIL 1, 1973. If you have taken college courses while still attending high school or if you were enrolled in a remedial program before April 1, 1973, you are still eligible for a Grant.
3. You will be enrolled in an eligible program at an eligible college, university, vocational or technical school, and you will be attending on a full-time basis.
4. You are a U.S. Citizen or are in the Unit-
