Clark County Welfare Rights organization is making preparations to attend the National Welfare Rights Conference July 11 - 14 in St. Louis.

The conference entitled "Strategies for Survival - II" will have workshops concerning senior citizens, S.S.I., food stamps, health and political empowerment. The Master of Ceremonies will be the Reverend Bernard Lee with Speakers to include Reverend Ralph Abernathy, Reverend Jessie Jackson, Gary, Indiana, Major Richard Hatcher, in addition to Congresspersons William Clay and Yvonne Burke.

A bus will be chartered to carry forty people from Las Vegas to the convention. People will be asked to make their hotel reservations directly with the Jefferson Hotel in St. Louis. Anyone interested in attending the conference is urged to call Clark County Welfare Rights.

NEVADA GRANTS

WASHINGTON -- Congressman David Towell has announced that the Labor Department has allocated \$50,000 to the State of Nevada to provide part-time employment for older workers.

Those eligible for the program will be jobless persons 55 years of age and older with income below the federally established poverty level who have poor employment prospects.

Towell said the program will be handled primarily by national organizations presently sponsoring older worker programs, such as the National Council of Senior Citizens, the National Retired Teachers Associations and the U.S. Forest Service.

According to an announcement by Congressman Davis Towell, So. Nevada colleges and universities will receive more than \$430,556,00 for their National Direct Student Loan programs.
