

## NEW SBA DISTRICT OFFICE

WASHINGTON---Senators Alan Bible and Howard Cannon announced today approval of upgrading the Small Business Administration's branch facility in Nevada to that of a District Office.

This new concept will streamline procedures and expedite the processing of loan applications since the Las Vegas office will now be able to make final decisions rather than the present procedure of farming them out to the San Francisco office for decision.

In making this decision, Small Business Administrator Thomas S. Kleppe recognized the record loan activity in Nevada in recent years. In 1967, when loans were first processed in the Las Vegas Office, there were 9 loans for a total of \$155,000, whereas in fiscal year 1974, 125 loans were approved for a loan total of 5,200,000.

The Nevada Senators said this new District Office will assist Nevada bankers, businessmen and local officials in processing applications and results in greater loan efficiency by having all parties to loan transactions closer at hand. Furthermore, we feel "a Nevada District Office will have a better understanding of the economy of our State and will be more sympathetic to local needs as well."
