

TWO MAJOR ENDORSEMENTS FOR THOMPSON

Nevada Supreme Court Chief Justice Gordon Thompson's re-election campaign received a boost today with the announcement that the National Committeemen of Nevada's Democratic and Republican parties have endorsed his candidacy for another term on the high court.

Democratic national committeeman Grant Sawyer and Republican national committeeman William Laub made the announcement jointly in Las Vegas and urged Nevadans to support the bipartisan effort to re-elect Justice Thompson.

Former Governor Sawyer called Thompson "A man of great integrity and competence and one who has served brilliantly in his years on the court."

Laub, Chairman of the Board of Southwest Gas Company, said, "as a former practicing Attorney and now a businessman, I have a deep and abiding respect for the law. In his 13 years on the Supreme Court, Gordon Thompson has proven to me that he's the right man for the job."
