REV. JESSIE JACKSON RECEIVES PUBLIC HEALTH ASSOCIATION CITATION



The Reverend Jesse Louis Jackson, founder and President of Operation PUSH (People United to Save Humanity), received the Presidential Citation of the American Public Health Association, during its Annual Meeting in New Orleans.

The 33-year-old Jackson, a prominent figure on the non-violent civil rights front for the past fifteen years, was cited during the meeting's opening general session by APHA president Lorin E. Kerr, MD, who praised Jackson for his "concern for the total health and well-being of all people...combined with a compelling drive to improve the quality of life."

Jackson founded Operation PUSH in 1971 "to direct the transition of the human rights movement from primary emphasis on civil rights to primary emphasis on civil economics," through negotiations with major industrial corporations for additional financial benefits to Black workers and businessmen; consumer service programs; nutrition projects, including surveillance of quality and cost of foods sold in community markets; a national conference focusing on the problems of Black colleges; a national African Relief Campaign to deliver food and medical supplies to West African countries stricken by drought; and the PUSH Expo, designed to give visibility to the products and services of Black businessmen.
