"Invitation to a Burglar," the first program in the six-part PBS series Burglar-Proofing, airs Thursday, October 3 at 10:30 p.m. on channel 10.

TV host Kene Holliday has three ex-burglars to help him get the message across. Fred, Pete, and Mike show the kind of mistakes made by residents that help burglars break in.

Mike, a second-story man, demonstrates how posing as a window-washer gained him entrance to suburban homes. Pete, working alone and with a partner, shows how easy it is to break into poorly protected apartments. He also describes how unsuspecting residents provide information about themselves and their neighbors that tell a burglar when to arrive. Fred shows why many inner-city dwellings are prime targets for thieves.

There is no such thing as a completely burglar-proof home, host Holliday explains and cautions. But there are measures viewers can take to help protect themselves and their property. These inexpensive steps, from simply turning the radio up while absent and installing proper locks, deter break-ins because they add the element of time to the thief's plans. And time is the bug-aboo that discourages a would-be thief from breaking in.

Leading the Baltimore team on that day was a new arrival to the NFL--Johnny Unitas, a brash 26 year old quarterback removed from the quasipro Bloomfield Rams of the Pittsburg suburbs. It was the first of many games that was to make Unitas one of gridiron's greatest field generals.

'The Way It Was' reunites Unitas and Ray Berry and another great Colt end, Lenny Moore, to relive that memorable day. The Giants are represented by Superstar Frank Gifford, Kyle Rote, and quarterback Charlie Connerly.


