TRICK OR TREAT

Halloween is one of the most fun party times, for the young and old. Other than collecting treats, youngsters gather money for worth while organizations. Although it would be awfully nice to make dozens of nourishing cookies for all trick or treaters who ring your door bell. But at least for your own and other quite special children, here are some lip-smacking recipes which also will offer a lot of good nutrition. Lots of us remember the ole Halloween of soaping windows, turning over out-houses, and many other things we got whippings for. "We've come a long way, Baby" as the new saying goes.

HOBGOBLIN RAISIN MERINGUES

1 (3 oz.) pkg. orange gelatin 1 cup sugar 1/4 tsp. salt 2/3 cup egg whites (5 to 7) 1 cup raisins 1 (3-1/2 oz.) can flaked coconut

In a small bowl, combine gelatin, sugar and salt. In a larger mixer bowl beat egg whites until soft peaks form. Gradually beat in gelatin, sugar mixture. Continue until peaks are very stiff. Stir in raisins and coconut. Drop by tablespoons, I inch apart on greased and floured baking sheet. Bake at 275 degrees for 40 minutes. Turn off heat and let stand in oven over night. Remove from baking sheet and store in covered container. Makes about 4 dozen.

RAISIN CREAM CHEESE GEMS

1/4 cup butter
1 (8 oz. pkg.) cream cheese
1 egg yolk
1 tsp. vanilla
1 (1 lb. 4-1/2 oz.) pkg. yellow cake mix
1-1/4 cups seedless raisins
1/4 cup shredded coconut
1/4 cup chopped walnuts

Beat together butter, cream cheese, egg yolk and vanilla. Blend in dry cake mix, 1/3 at a time, mixing last portion by hand. Mix last raisins, coconut and walnuts. Drop by level tablespoons onto greased baking sheet. Bake in moderate oven at 350 degrees for about 15 minutes, or until lightly browned.

RIPE OLIVE HALLOWEEN MOUSSE

1-1/2 cups canned pitted ripe olives
3 envelopes unflavored gelatin
2-1/2 cups cold water
2 (10 oz.) cans condensed cheddar cheese soup
1/2 cup mayonnaise
1/4 cup lemon juice
1/2 tsp. worchestershire sauce
1/4 tsp. salt
Dash cayenne
1 cup chopped celery
3 cups diced ham

Cut olives into wedges. Sprinkle gelatin on water to soften. Place over low heat. Stir in soup, mayonnaise, lemon juice, worchestershire sauce, salt and cayenne. Cool until slightly thickened. Fold in olives, celery and ham. Turn into 10 cup mold. Chill until firm.

WITCHES BREW

1 cup lemon juice 2/3 cup molasses 1/3 cup sugar 2 qts. water 2 sticks cinnamon 10 whole cloves orange slices cloves for garnish

In large saucepan combine lemon juice, molasses, sugar and water. Add cinnamon and cloves. Simmer for 10 minutes. Strain. Pour into punch bowl. Float orange slices with cloves.
