Open House Set At Nellis

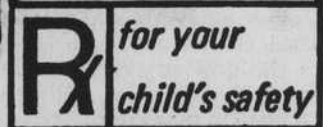
The gates at Nellis Air Force Base will open wide for visitors Saturday, November 23.

Scheduled for display are the F4 Phantom, the F105 Thunderchief, the A7D Corsair, the T38 Talon, and the newest tactical fighter-bomber in the inventory, the variable sweep wing F111.

SCHOOLS ARE URGED TO SEND ARTICLES TO THE 'VOICE'



Thousands of children are the victims of terrible accidents every year, many of them unavoidable. But, according to Dr. Albert H. Domm, child safety specialist and medical director of the Prudential Insurance Company, many tragedies could be averted by clear, demonstrative parental warnings.

"The most important aspect of teaching youngsters proper safety habits is to be sure to associate the danger with the warning or admonishment," Dr. Domm stresses. "Too often, pre-school children don't connect disciplinary action with the behavior that prompts it."

As an example, he points out the hypothetical case of the tot who was told by his mother that he would be spanked if he went into the street. Thus, the next time the tot crossed the street, instead of looking for traffic, he glanced back over his shoulder to see if his mother was watching, and was struck by a car.

"You see," says Dr. Domm, "the child was fearful only of a spanking, and was not aware of the real danger — the automobile."

He reminds parents that in addition to making the danger clear to their young ones, they must protect and teach them through action and example.

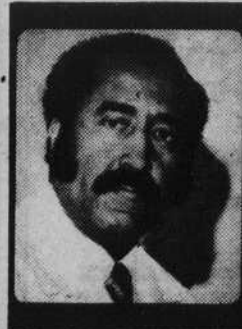

Fitzsimmons Program Gives Counseling Aid

The Fitzsimmons Halfway House, located at 620 West Madison Street, is designed to serve as an Intake Unit to those persons who are drug free and have not been able to adapt to a drug free way of life, for example, not being able to communicate with the necessary sources to obtain the general necessities of life-employment, housing, medication, etc. It is also for those who have been released from prisons and/or are on probation and for those who have not been able to adapt to a free way of life.

The services provided for these persons are individual counsel-

ing and group counseling. Individual counseling is a way of getting direct and personal information as to a person's goals and if he or she feels he/she may or may not be able to meet them. Group counseling is when these same persons meet together and exchange ideas and discuss the importance of having a goal and what one should or should not do to adapt to society. While receiving these services the Fitzsimmons resident should gain self-confidence.
