85 BLACKS WIN POSTS

In the recent election black candidates won 85 of the 118 major political races in which they were entered in eight southern states; 30 more seats instate houses and four more in state senates in 11 southern states, Voter Education Project (VEP) in Atlanta, Georgia said recently.

Stan Alexander, VEP research official, said blacks also added one more member in the U.S. Congress from the south.

Alexander said the 72 per cent victory per-formance was a new record. He said the gains were achieved mainly in medium to large size southern cities.

John Lewis, VEP executive director, said, "The fact that 94 blacks hold southern state leg-islative posts in 1974 is a fantastic achievement--the most significant breakthrough for blacks in southern politics since Reconstruc-
