## U.S.A. vs. U.S.S.R. Boxing

The United States Boxing team will be eyeing the "lucky seven" on Saturday, Jan. 18, when it meets the Soviet Union at Caesars Palace in the seventh matches of their historic home-and-home series.

In announcing that the Amateur Athletic Union of the United States had completed arrangements today for the annual boxing renewal at the eleven Olympic weight classes, Col. Donald F. Hull, AAU boxing administrator, predicted that the American team should be favored to win the 1975 championship.

"I am optimistic about our chances this year," Hull said, "because of the overall depth of our team, which has already dedicated itself to winning a gold medal for the United States in the 1976 Olympics at Montreal. Also, this being the seventh meeting of the two world powers, we are confident that the 'lucky seven' in Las Vegas will be in our favor."

The powerful Russians have a perfect 6-0 record in the series, although they have never won a match in the heavyweight division. Also, in the 1972 Olympics at Munich, the Americans won four medals as compared to two for the Russians.

Previous team scores, all in favor of the Soviet Union, are as follows: 1969 at Caesars Palace, 6-5; 1970 in Moscow, 8-3; 1971 at Caesars Palace 6-5; 1972 in Moscow, 9-2; 1973 at Caesars Palace, 6-5; 1974 in Moscow, 7-4.

The January 18 bouts, which will take place in Caesars Palace's 1,200 seat Circus Maximus theatre-restaurant, will be taped by the CBS television network and will be aired on January 19 from 1-2 p.m. (EST) on the CBS "Sports Spectacular" program.

The Russian team is scheduled to arrive in New York for a January 13 press conference and fly to Las Vegas the following day.

Hull also announced that six of the eleven USA team members have been selected to date. They are:

Heavyweight Nick Wells, of Fort Worth, Tex., who stopped Russian Yuri Nesterov in the first round at Caesars Palace in 1973. Light-welterweight Ray Leonard of Palmer Park Mo., who stands even with the Russians in two bouts, one victory and one defeat.

Featherweight Howard Davis of Glen Cove, N. Y., who recently won the World Amateur fea-

therweight title in Havana, Cuba, with a decision of Boris Kuznetsov of the Soviet Union. Davis won the only gold medal for the U. S. in that meet.

Bantamweight Miguel Ayala of San Antonio, Tex., who lost a close match to his Russian opponent in Moscow last year.

Flyweight Greg Richardson of Youngstown, Ohio, who was decisioned in Moscow in 1974.

Mini-flyweight Albert Sandoval of Los Angeles who is 1-1 in two matches with the Soviets.

Hull said the remaining five members of the American team would be determined in bouts that will be held in the next few days.
