

# STEELERS DO IT

Sunday, at Tulane Stadium in New Orleans before a crowd of 81,000 the Pittsburgh Steelers defeated the Minnesota Vikings 16-6.

After not winning a title in the last 42 years, Pittsburgh did an about face in lashing the Vikings 16-6 in Super Bowl No. IX.

The name of the game is defense and both teams showed exactly that in Sunday's contest. An error by the Vikings in the first half gave Pittsburgh a 2-0 lead. Tarkenton missed a hand-off on the eight yard line which fell into the end-zone giving the Steelers a touch-back and a 2-0 lead.

The Steelers defensive play by L.G. Greenwood, (mean) Joe Green, Ernie Holmes and Dwight White proved too much for a slow first

half Minnesota team. Harris scored from the nine yard line to give Pittsburgh a 9-0 lead. The Vikings scored on a block kick to make the score 9-6. After missing an extra point which hit the crossbar, the score remained 9-6.

The Steelers scored again later in the game with a four yard pass from Bradshaw to Brown, to ice the game for good.

The Vikings were held to only 21 yards rushing for a new Super Bowl record.

Franco Harris set two Super Bowl records with 34 rushes and 158 yards. He was also named the games most valuable player.

The people in Pittsburgh should feel proud of their team. After all it only took 42-years to bring home the title.

## JOHN BAYER SELECTED CHAIRMAN

Former head Rebel basketball coach John Bayer has been selected the interim acting chairman of the department of physical education at the University of

Nevada, Las Vegas. Bayer, 36, began his new assignment this week and will continue in the post until July 1 when the department faculty will take its an-

nual vote on the chairmanship.

Bayer replaces Bill Daniel, who stepped down as chairman last month for personal reasons.

We're sorry that Bill will be unable to complete the academic year as chairman, because he was doing an excellent job of preparing the department for its big move next month into the new physical education complex on campus," said Dean Saville. "But I'm confident in the ability of John Bayer to see everything through."

The \$6 million P. E. complex features a 50-meter indoor swimming pool, two gymnasiums, classrooms, offices and training areas which will get heavy use by people from on and off the campus.

Bayer has served as an associate professor of physical education at the university since 1973. For three years previously, he was head basketball coach for the Rebels.
