Hoping to notch their first victory in the Eastern Athletic Conference, Howard University hosts Morgan State College, the defending NCAA Division II basketball champions, this Saturday night. Morgan sports a 6-3 record thus far and is currently ranked in the small college top ten by Associated Press. The Bears, coached by Nat Taylor defeated Howard twice last season.

Led by 7-foot center Marvin "The Human Eraser" Webster, last season's NCAA Division II Tourney "Most Valuable Player," Morgan has been tabbed the favorite to win the MEAC regular season and tournament title. The newest member

of college basketball's exclusive 1500 club for career rebounders, Webster already has 1809, (the collegiate record is 2334 by Steubenville's Jim Smith in 1955-58).

The senior blocked 249 shots last year, averaged 21.4 points per game and shot .545 from the field in making consensus All-American.
