4,000 GOLD CARD HOLDERS

More than 4,000 senior citizens hold Gold Cards from the Clark County School District, according to school board president Earl Evans.

The cards allow the holder free admission to anything sponsored by the school district, its schools, or clubs, and organizations operating under the policies of the school district. All residents of Clark County 65 years of age and older are eligible.

Cardholders may be accompanied by a guest of any age when attending school functions.

"This allows grandparents to entertain a grandchild without spending a lot of money," according to Evans.

"It also helps many older people who no longer drive and must depend on someone younger than age 65 for transportation," he said.

Gold Cards are used mostly by sports enthusiasts to attend high school athletic contests. However, the card is also good for free admission to school plays and musicals, and even to such things as donkey basketball games sponsored by school clubs.

Anyone living in Clark County and over 65 years of age should call the Clark County School District's Office of Information Services. A card will be issued by mail.

School lunch prices DROP

The price of school lunches at all grade levels is going down February 1.

The decrease was voted by the Clark County Board of School Trustees, but only after hearing warnings from school administrators that prices might have to go back up again next fall. It all depends on inflationary trends and efficiency generated by higher student demand for school lunches.

Increased volume overall, more emphasis on Federally subsidized Type A--or balanced-- lunches at the secondary level, and the introduction of carbonated soft drinks at cafeteria windows have combined to make the school district's lunch program more efficient.

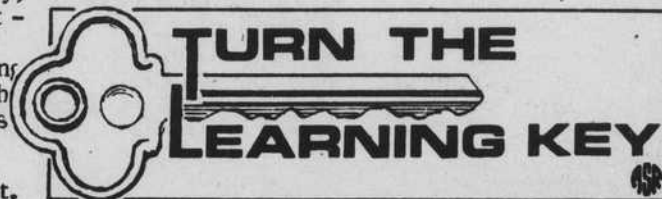
The introduction of soft drinks has generated additional revenue, plus an additional \$60,000 returned to student

councils to support their programs.

At the same time the carbonated beverages have kept more students on campus for lunch, thus increasing standard food sales.

Finally, a series of "combos" -- balanced lunches based on a sandwich, a milk-shake or milk, and french fries or salad, has shifted the emphasis away from a la carte items to plate lunches. The Federal hot lunch program does not subsidize a la carte items, but it does help pay for balanced plates, revenue for the food service program.

The five-cent reduction will save families better than \$4.00 per student eating lunch at school every day for the balance of the year. Elementary youngsters will pay 45¢ per day, while secondary pupils will pay 45¢ to 70¢, depending on the combo entree they choose.
