



METRO COMPUTERIZES

Criminals in Southern Nevada, will be easier to catch as a result of action by the Metro Police Commission Tuesday. Local police will have computers on their side.

The Commission several years ago okayed in concept a multi-million dollar project to link patrol cars with computers to provide

almost instant data. Initially the system included only Clark County and Las Vegas.

Tuesday, the Commission approved of an application for Federal funds to tie in North Las Vegas, Henderson and Boulder City as well.

It took a long time. MPD Deputy Chief, Ray Gubser, project director, said Tuesday.

The concept was first accepted in 1970, with the first grant materializing the next year. By now \$1.2 million has been spent from Federal funds, with the City of Las Vegas having kicked in \$133,000 of its own money.

The Department now will request grants of \$490,241 for next year and \$272,745 for the next

year that to add the three extra cities.

Besides time, this money from the Law Enforcement Assistance Administration (LEAN) the district will have to come up with \$76,298 of its own.

The MPD applied munications Commission (FCC), back in May for a license to transmit. The FCC was slow in

acting, and at last report none of the MPD cars were hooked up with the system, which is designed to give them such information as criminal records and license number identification.

Gubser predicted five cars would be plugged in by March 1, with another 20 per month until some 80 were operative.

Once the LEAN funds

are approved for North Las Vegas, Henderson, and Boulder, it is expected to take another two years to have them connected to the system.

In other action, the Commission:

--Authorized the Dept to go to bid for the repair of the fourth floor of the Courthouse, which was damaged recently.

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HELP FOR NEVADAS JOBLESS

Washington -- Nevada will receive more than \$4 million under a new public jobs program that went into effect earlier this month. Sens. Howard Cannon and Paul Laxalt said today.

The program, Title 6 of the Comprehensive Employment and Training Act (CETA), is de-

signed to help reduce unemployment in the state and nationwide by providing federal funds for local public jobs, they said.

Of the total, the Las Vegas Consortium will receive nearly \$2.6 million, with Las Vegas earmarked for \$1.37 million and Clark County for \$1.2 million. Washoe County will

receive nearly \$603,000 with Reno to get \$363,000 of that total.

Balance of State funds total slightly more than \$833,000, said Nevada's senators.

The funds, administered at the federal level by the Department of Labor, are the final allocation under the one-year Title 6 CETA program.

DICK GREORY CLAIMS C.I.A. KILLED KENNEDY

Comedian Dick Gregory, catapulted to national prominence by his political activities, has presented the Rockefeller Commission with evidence which he claims proves that President John F. Kennedy was killed by the CIA and not by Lee Harvey Oswald.

Gregory said he got his proof from a blown-up amateur moving picture film of the assassination and a newspaper photograph made after the shooting in Dallas, Texas.

The Warren Commission, which investigated the assassination for the government, has examined the same film before, along with other investigators.

The Rockefeller Commission was created by President Ford to investigate possible U. S. spying by the CIA. A spokesman for the commission said that Gregory's evidence would be considered.

One of two of Gregory associates, Robert Groden, 29 a photographer, showed the moving picture film at a Washington news conference, and the other associate Ralph Schoeman, unveiled a still photograph which he said showed E. Howard Hunt and Frank Sturgis both convicted Watergate conspirators at the scene of the assassination.

Zapruder's film shows Kennedy clutching at his throat and beginning to lean forward after he is first hit; then suddenly the right side of his head explodes--he rocks violently backwards and to the right.

Groden said, "This proves that Kennedy was killed by a shot from the front and not from the rear." The Warren Commission said Kennedy was shot from the rear.

Groden also said, the film shows a rifleman hiding in a clump of trees and another man

pointing a rifle from a hill near where Zapruder was standing, while he filmed the assassination.

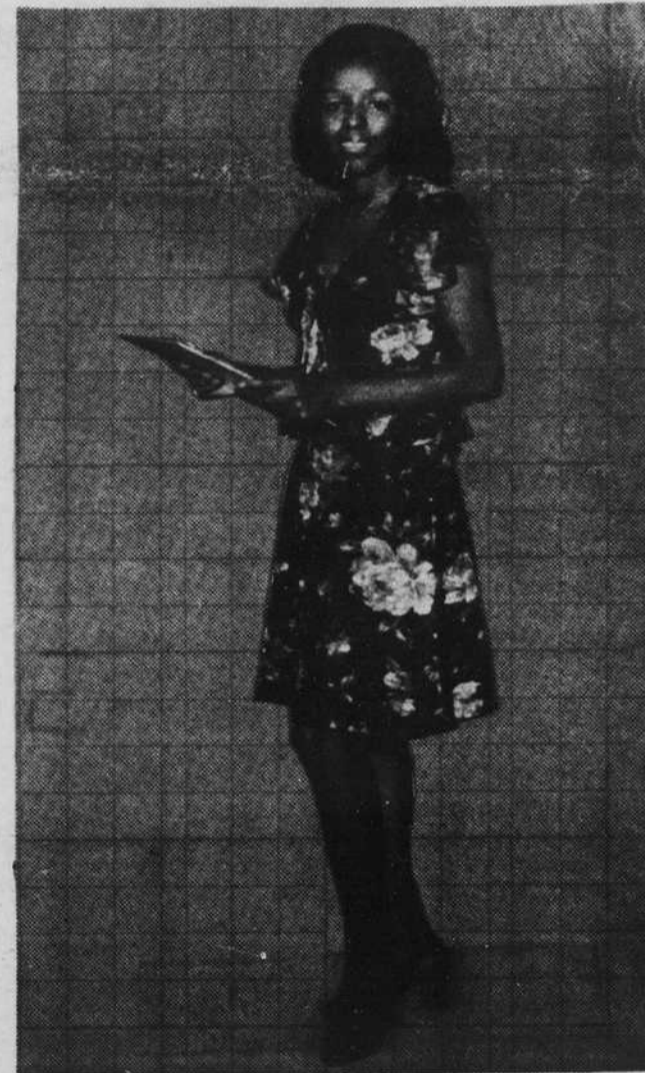
However, reporters at the news conference could not decide whether the film showed hidden men or shadowy effects caused by leaves and poor lighting in the amateurish film.

Schoeman then said, his photograph showed Hunt and Sturgis in custody with a third man soon after the assassination. "The third man is a dead ringer for an FBI sketch of a man wanted in the slaying of Martin Luther King Jr."

Schoeman added the men he identified as Hunt and Sturgis were CIA operatives, disguised as tramps.

Gregory and his associates accusations come on the heels of over 100 such amateur investigations in the Dallas area, along with other parts of the United States.
