

VO-TECH OPEN HOUSE SOUL CLUBS OF CLARK COUNTY

To celebrate Vocational Education Week, February 0-15, Southern Nevada Vocational Technical Center of Clark County School District, will hold their Annual Open House on Thursday, February 13, 1975 7:00 PM until 9:00 PM.

The theme this year is "Vocational Education For Productive Careers," and the high school students who attend S.N.V.T.C. are well prepared to enter the world of work with job entry skills following two years of training in the vocation of their choice.

Students and instructors are preparing exhibits in the following vocational areas: Airframe & Powerplant Mechanics; Auto Mechanics; Auto Body Repair; Electronics; Drafting; Cosmetology; Refrigeration; Carpentry; Printing; Data Processing; Secretarial & Clerical; Culinary Arts; Telecommunications; Health Services and Turf Management. The academic areas of Communications; Social Studies; Physical Education & Health will also host the visitors to show current learning programs taught in connection with the vocational programs.

Parents and members of the business community are invited to view the exhibits prepared by each department and to discuss students' progress with faculty members.

Soul Clubs of Clark County met, January 31, at Vo-Tech. The clubs were presented with a luncheon prepared by the Culinary Arts Department of Vo-Tech.

After the luncheon all the schools submitted a brief summary of their weekly activities for Black History Week. Activities have been scheduled every day, such as: African dress; Black and African Art Exhibits; Fashion shows; Soul Food Luncheons; Assemblies (displaying the various a-

chievements and talents of Blacks); and a dance to celebrate the occasion.

Every school chose a theme, in which all of their events will evolve around. They are as follows: Clark-To All My People; Eldorado-Black Glidascoppe; Rancho-Heritage; Vo-Tech-Where Do We Go From Here?; and Western-Time Brings About a Change.

The meeting was organized by Mr. Al Brown and the Soul Club advisors.
