

NEW YORK CITY--A long ago report here has been confirmed by the announcement that Robinson, one of the more successful Black artist mgrs. he's teamed up with exchorus girl and last wife of the great "Bojangles" Elaine Robinson, to get the job done. The flick is budgeted at \$3-mil, a lot of it is Black dough, and the screenplay has been assigned to Marshall Williams and Pat Bohannan. Gordon, who manages the 5th-Dimension, hopes to star the exciting Ben Vereen opposite Marilyn Mc-Coo, of the Fifth-D. She would fill the role of Fanny Robinson, Bill's 2nd and best known spouse. "The Man from Nazareth." a religious musical on the life of Jesus, seen through the eyes of Black slaves, could be a "God-send" for a Lincoln Center offering. Prof. Edward Boatner composed and arranged the music which matches the choreography of Jessie Oliver and the voices of the Art of Black Music Masters Singers... Jake McKinney, Black publicist for American International Pictures, is running for western vice president of the International Alliance of Theatrical Stage Employees Publicists Guild Local 818 ... The friend is Dr. Leon Sullivan of OIC ... Clarence Clyde Ferguson, Jr., a Black who holds the United States mission to the United Nations' 4th highest rank as representative to the

Economic and Social Council, is leaving to return to teach at the Harvard Law School where he was the school's first Black faculty member. He also was law dean at Rutgers and Howard Universities. .. It was Justice Thurgood Marshall who delivered the Supreme Court opinion which ruled that minority employees who belong to a union cannot start their own independent outside bargaining unit to negotiate claims of racial discrimination ... Two white Labor Dept. employees have filed charges of reverse discrimination against two key Black officials in the department's anti-discrimination program. Both cases have attracted major attention from unions, civil rights orgs and Congress. ... Smithsonian scientists are studying two Black male skeletons, unearthed in an abandoned Virgin Island cememery, that suggests there might have been Blacks in the West Ind. more than two centuries before Columbus. African slaves were introduced to St. Thomas in 1673 to work in cane fields. There are no historical references to a Black presence before that -- until now -- STAY LOOSE. * * * * * *
