Voter Registration

This election will mark the first time that the Clark County Election Department will be responsible for conducting the elections for Las Vegas, Henderson and Boulder City. These three cities have entered into an Agreement with Clark County to provide this election service. North Las Vegas will continue, as in the past, to administer their

For the purpose of Absentee Voting, requests for absentee ballots must be received on or before April 29th. Requests received after that time cannot legally be honored. Registered voters living in North Las Vegas, Henderson, or Boulder City, should send their absentee ballot requests to the Clark County Election Department, 400 Las Vegas

Boulevard South, Las Vegas, Nevada 89101.

This same procedure for Absentee Voting will hold true for the cities General Election to be held June 3rd, 1975. Absentee ballot requests for that election must be received on or before May 27th, 1975.

Remember again, absentee ballot requests for North Las Vegas, Henderson, or Boulder City must be sent in care of the city clerk in those areas. and absentee ballot requests for the City of Las Vegas should be sent to the Clark County Election Department.
